This year the Traditional Karate Jacksonville Dojo opened in Jacksonville, North Carolina to educate the community about Japanese martial arts. In a martial arts society in which eclectic combative systems have become the dominant trend, our dojo offers an opportunity to reconnect with the roots from which Karatedo and other forms of Budo originally emerged. The main martial art taught is Karatedo from the Gima-Ha Shotokan-Ryu lineage, and other arts such as Okinawa Kobudo and Nihon Jujutsu will be soon included. Kokusai Budoin, IMAF A Brief History

In 1951, a group of Japan's most prominent martial artists from a variety of disciplines gathered in November of that year to discuss the first, large-scale open demonstration of Japanese martial arts since the end of World War II. In January the next year, The National Japan Health Association was founded. It would later be called the Kokusai Budoin, International Martial Arts Federation.

Kokusai Budoin, IMAF was officially founded in January, 1952 by Master Kyuzo Mifune, Master Kazuo Ito and Shizuya Sato of Judo; Master Hakudo Nakayama and Master Hiromasa Takano of Kendo; Master Hironori Otsuka of Karate-do, and Kiyotaka Wake and Sueo Kiyoura. The first Chairman was Prince Tsunenori Kaya.

1952: The 1st All Japan Budo Exhibition was held in Hibiya Park, Tokyo, Japan.

Kokusai Budoin, IMAF is comprised of the following divisions: Judo, Kendo, Karatedo, Aikido, Iaido, Nihon Jujutsu and Kobudo. As an international certification headquarters for the martial arts, IMAF commends meritorious individuals by granting degrees, grades and awards. The Federation sponsors regular exhibitions, tournaments and publishes pertinent information concerning Japanese Martial Arts.
